Accomplishments

Weed Removal

Ambassadors worked diligently to eradicate overgrowth in the district. The effort will continue throughout June.

Parking Lot 4

Ambassadors thoroughly cleaned and weeded the parking lot located on 5th and Salem streets, as well as some other select areas around the district.

Bags of Trash & Leaves

Every day, Ambassadors arrive to a trashed district. Within two hours, by 9 AM, majority of the litter is picked up before anyone can see it.

On a typical day, Ambassadors remove anywhere from 4-10 full bags of trash in those two hours alone.

Bags of trash, spills and graffiti all increased in May. We will continue to monitor this trend.








Bags of Trash & Leaves -- November 2017 through May 2018

Chico Retail Watch

The operations manager coordinated with the Chico Chamber of Commerce to create a Facebook group for connecting business owners and managers so that they can network to reduce shoplifting by posting pictures and sharing information about who to be on the lookout for.

The Chamber provided handouts that the Ambassadors distributed to downtown merchants to encourage participation. The operations manager also volunteers as a group moderator and liason for the downtown area.






